


President's Message

Dave Dobos '73

With this newsletter, our alumni organization begins its first ever comprehensive fundraising effort. Yes, we have raised money through the years via concession stand sales at athletic events, West High School merchandise sales, our annual golf outing, the silent auction at our December luncheon, and, of course, from hundreds of unsolicited gifts from alumni that have funded most of the \$190,000 in scholarships we've awarded to graduating West High School seniors over the last 25 years. Yet, outside of a direct appeal seven years ago for funds to purchase used weightlifting equipment for student athletes and to help shore up a depleted operations treasury (alumni generously donated approximately \$9000 via that effort), we haven't made a concerted effort to ask alumni for their financial support. Then, the coronavirus hit...

Last month I received a call from Robin Schmidt '49 Jan, a former president of this association. He knew the coronavirus had caused us to cancel most of this year's alumni events, which would result in us missing out on the revenues they would generate, crippling our ability to provide the financial resources for scholarships and school-related projects. He pledged \$1000 on the spot and offered to call several alumni he knew who he felt might be willing and able to provide similar help. I replied that I would match his pledge and ask our Board for its approval to move forward with a comprehensive effort to raise the funds needed to keep our initiatives moving forward. We set a realistic dollar objective, one that is ambitious, yet attainable. We intend to raise \$25,000 by the end of the year.



The name Leadership Campaign is apt for this effort for several reasons. First, it is our organization's leadership, both past and current, that is leading the charge. Second, by working to achieve this objective, we are setting an example for both the West High School and greater west Columbus communities about what we collectively can accomplish. Finally, as we succeed with this effort, we will help position West HS to lead its young people to improved academic and extra-curricular outcomes. Indeed, we are providing opportunities for alumni to designate how their gifts can benefit students—through scholarships, academics, athletics, and the performing and visual arts, among others.



The West HS Alumni Association Embarks on The Leadership Campaign

An Initial Effort to Raise \$25,000 by December 31, 2020

To Advance West High School—Its Students, Academics, Athletics, the Performing & Visual Arts, and Our Alumni Organization's Operations

Why and why now?

We are living in unprecedented times. The coronavirus has affected us in unforeseen and unfortunate ways. Nationally,

the shutdown of businesses, schools, and churches have resulted in economic and social upheaval. The implementation of social distancing requirements has changed the way we interact with one another. Some of us have lost loved ones and many more know of others who have become seriously ill.

On a local level, the coronavirus has caused the cancellation of the events our West HS Alumni Association regularly produces for its members. This year we have been forced to forego our Summer Picnic, Golf Outing, Hall of Fame Induction Celebration, Hilltop Bean Dinner participation, football game food concessions, and several membership meetings. These events promote camaraderie among our graduates as well as raise money for the scholarships we provide our young people and that helps us manage our organization.

Instead of retracting, it is now time for us to lead.

We need to do our part to help our young people pursue higher education. Our school needs our assistance with its academic mission as well as with specific athletic and arts-related needs that non-existent booster organizations cannot provide. We can assure that our organization remains strong so that it can continue to serve our members and our school. Over the last several

years, we have provided funding for a sousaphone for the marching band, script rental for a school musical, weightlifting equipment for the athletic department, building materials for the girls

softball team dugout, and materials to equip a wellness and study area for the teachers and support staff. We also have continued to fund scholarships for graduating seniors, now exceeding \$190,000 over the last 25 years. Indeed, together we have accomplished a lot. Unfortunately, the coronavirus will hamper our ability to continue these efforts until it is defeated.

We ask you to consider making a financial gift to the West High School Alumni Association, designating it toward your desired purpose(s). Our objective is to raise \$25,000 by the end of the year. In so doing, you will help build the legacy we pass to a new generation.

Pledges and collections already have reached \$3900.

Security

The WHSAA is a 501(c)3 organization and will provide charitable contribution documentation for all contributors to this campaign. As we become successful with this fundraising effort, our intent is to affiliate with the Columbus Foundation to facilitate the security of our organization's assets and to obtain a greater return on our invested funds. Via our organization's bylaws, the Board of Directors only will have the authority to disperse funds, not any one individual.

To date, we have secured \$3900 in pledges and gifts toward our \$25,000 goal. We ask you to consider how you can participate in this collective effort. We welcome all gifts. Each is important, no matter the size. I always have marveled at the support and generosity of our alumni community and will report our progress to you both in the next newsletter and, God willing, at our December luncheon.


Hilltop Pool as a Member and as an Owner

As a member of the pool, I had great times as a kid. I remember after changing into my swimsuit I would put my clothes in a basket and the clothes check person would give me a pin with a number on it. I remember watching the girls dance and trying to look cool while hanging out at the juke box behind the building. I remember playing basketball and getting into the pool to rinse the sweat off and to cool off. By having a pool membership, we could later get a discount at "Bob's Putt-Putt" in Great Western Shopping Center. That was also a good time!

As an owner of the pool, I had to work at it to make it successful and to try to make a profit. If I hired things done, I would have not made any profit at all.

Weather was also a big factor in the swimming pool business. There were multiple different activities to try to stay "afloat!" A favorite thing at the pool was the tube slide and the basketball hoop for the kids to play with by the deep end of the pool. There were moonlight swims when we stayed open after hours for members only. We had a video game room with 25 cent

games to play to keep the kids entertained. We had a balloon launch on July 4th to raise money for Easter Seals. We sold helium balloons for \$1.00 and then we put the member's name on the balloon. We launched the balloons and whoever's balloon got sent back from the farthest distance from the pool got a free pool membership the following year.

Two times we got flooded and many pool members were a great support. Many came to help clean the pool and get it ready to open again. We had an afterhours BBQ for everyone who helped.

In the off season, we sold Christmas trees and all profits went to Recreation Unlimited - a camp for handicapped children in Delaware, Ohio. At the end of the season, we would have a yard sale at the pool. Members would get a space to sell their belongings and talk about the season.

There were many great memories, great members, and great staff which made the season go well. I remember something funny when my best friend, Jeff Clark, and I were pulling vines down off the fence at the basketball court and we both got poison ivy!

Connie and Mike Cahill took over the pool in 1994, and they sold it to Jim and Kelly Campbell in 2005.

Summers Past

Throwback in Time - Hilltop Pool

Many West High Alumni spent many hours at this well-known Hilltop landmark, both for pleasure and employment. The Hilltop Pool, located in Valleyview on Valleyview Dr., is the largest swimming pool in the city of Columbus (139' x 150').

Built in 1929 by the American Legion, the site was named Curtis Bender Park in honor of Sgt. Curtis Bender, the first Hilltopper killed in WWI. At the close of the war, an American Legion Post was organized and named the Curtis Bender Post. To finance the swimming pool, pledges were raised by the Legion. The site included the pool, picnic area, and a miniature golf course. Unfortunately, the park suffered severe financial problems during the Depression – pledges fell off, and problems arose with the city about sanitation of the water. In 1931, the Legion sold the park to Charles A. Cruea, a local businessman who operated a store at the corner of Hague and Steele. Cruea was known to dam up the creek behind the pool and stock it with fish. Anglers would catch the fish and then buy them by the pound from Cruea.

Cruea added an outdoor skating rink in the early 1940's, known as the "Hilltop Moonlight Roller Rink." It was located on the east side of the site, where the Basketball court is now situated. The Roller Rink was open until midnight, five nights a week. In 1943 the Skating Rink was managed by Bob and Aili Case, Hilltop residents who purchased the pool in 1944. The rink was closed in 1946 due to lack of interest, and the pool beach area was extended. The Bath House was rebuilt in 1953, and in 1960 the small pool was constructed near the Basketball Court for swim teams and added swim lessons.

The Cases operated the pool for 41 years before selling it to **Steve and Connie Hedges** in 1985. Hedges is a 1967 graduate of West. Connie had been employed by the Cases since 1966, teaching many little Hilltoppers swimming lessons, and Steve was the pool manager in 1984. The Hedges have made a few changes, but the pool is basically the same as it has been for 60 years. The Hedges are also active in the work of the Easter Seal Society and sponsor various fund-raisers for that organization.

One of this writer's fond memories is from the '50's, when several off-duty Columbus Fire Fighters served as Lifeguards and Swimming Instructors. Do you remember Larry Sears, Jim Seagle, Ralph Burden, Dick Westkamp, and Bill and Bela Peterfy?


A note on the Cases:

A sideline to the swimming pool business was the sale of Christmas trees at the pool. From the 1940's through his term as owner, Bob Case sold 12,000 trees a season until artificial trees became popular. Case leased land in Nova Scotia to grow better trees.

For several years he supplied cash prizes and the "Bob Case Trophy" at the annual Bear River (Nova Scotia) Tree Cutter's Association Trap Shoot. An avid golfer, Case owned and operated "Bob's Putting Golf" from 1956-1976, at Great Western and Graceland Shopping Centers.

Update on Former West Vice Principal - Miss Blanche Kern

In the spring newsletter we asked if any of our alumni recalled any information about **Ms. Blanche Kern**, the West Vice Principal from 1929, when West High opened on Powell Ave., until

she retired in 1952. We wanted to share the memories that two alumni shared

2004 Hall of Fame Honoree, Joan Smith Reppert '48, called from Pennsylvania to share her memories of Miss Kern. Joan let us know she was a student volunteer clerk in Miss Kern's office. Joan said she occasionally felt somewhat embarrassed when Miss Kern would call a female student in to her office (while Joan was doing filing) and criticize the student for something she had done. Miss Kern never asked her to leave while talking with another student. But Joan's favorite memory was when she took her 4th year Latin class. In those days, West had one vice principal. In addition to those duties, Miss Kern also taught the Latin class. Per Joan, "We

read Vergil's Aeneid, and both boys and girls loved her class. It was so refreshing after working our ways for three years through Caesar's Gallic Wars and then Cicero's Orations! Ms. Kern had beautiful white hair and was always a lady. She was uncompromising and greatly admired by her Latin Students.

Bruce Findlay '63 remembered that his cousin, Louise Bitzer Jordan '50 Jan., had spoken about Miss Kern. He talked with her to see what she could tell us about her memo-

ries of Miss Kern. Louise did not have much contact with Miss Kern except she remembered Miss Kern inviting each of the senior girls into her office before graduation to ask what their plans were after they graduated. We do not know if Miss Kern gave any guidance based on what the graduate related. Based on what we have gotten from the yearbooks, we know that many of the ladies did go to college, some to business school, and others straight to the work force. Whatever Miss Kern advised them to do, we are certain it was beneficial to them. After hearing that Joan Reppert took Latin from Miss Kern, Bruce recalled that both of his parents also took Latin from her during their days at West.



Thank you, Joan, Bruce, and Louise for sharing your memories of Miss Kern. We have forwarded the information to the Greenlawn Cemetery Abbey coordinator. It was their inquiry that prompted our request.

I am Jerry Solinger, Class of June 1949. I noticed the 1946 West Junior High baseball team photo, in the Summer Issue. I am in the photo, second guy from the left, in the front row. Ms. Thrush erroneously identified the coach as Mack Pemberton. The coach pictured is Orrie Lehman. Coach Pemberton did coach a number of teams and sports while at West. His 1947 football team went undefeated and untied. One of the star players on that team was Bill Thrush's brother, Jack Thrush, who was elected first team All Ohio End. Jack was the outstanding athlete in the school, making the All City League team in the three major sports.

I enjoy the West High Alumni Occident, even though I only see it by the courtesy of a former classmate. Incidentally, I am blessed to have precisely two dozen grandchildren AND precisely two dozen great grandchildren. Why don't you publish this letter and see if anyone can top that? Yearbooks for Sale!



In 2001, we let our membership know we would accept any yearbooks they wanted to donate. The first yearbooks we received were used to build a Yearbook Library. Through the generous donation of many alumni, we were able to build a collection of one yearbook for every West graduation year starting with 1912 through 2018 - except 1913, 1917, and 1994. Our Yearbook Library is a great resource for our newsletter editor to verify graduation years, find articles and pictures for the Alumni Newsletter, and look for information we often get questions for from alumni and alumni families. These generous yearbook donations have resulted in us having multiple yearbooks for

several years, especially for the graduation years of the 1920s through the 1950s. We often receive yearbooks when an alum is downsizing a home, when two alums are married and have duplicate yearbooks, and when a deceased alums family donates yearbooks. We sell the extra yearbooks to our alumni! Since 2001 we have sold over 400 yearbooks. That is almost \$12,000 of proceeds that have been deposited in our Alumni Scholarship

Foundation Fund.

We recently received a significant yearbook donation from Bill Weber '69. Bill is the son of two people that are familiar to many of our alumni. His father was former West teacher and administrator Richard Weber '43 and his mother was longtime West office secretary Donna

Inboden Weber '45. Per Bill, he and his parents all started at West at the same time - Bill as a 10th grader and his parents on the West staff! Bill and his wife live in Texas and were in Columbus to visit his mother. The donation included Mr. Weber's 1941 and 1942 yearbook from his school days and 1970 through 1989 yearbooks that Mr. and Mrs. Weber had purchased when they worked at West. He also donated a collection of five records from various Band, Orchestra, and Choir performances from 1967 through 1973; Bill's Varsity Letter Jacket with his Band 'Letter' still on it; several West Occident Newspapers; and several years of Commencement Programs. We already have some old West Occident newspapers in our Memorabilia and are adding the additional ones. The Columbus Public Library has been working on a project for over a year to scan all of our yearbooks into their permanent records. Eventually they will make these available to view on-line on the Library website. Once they complete scanning the yearbooks they plan to scan the West Occident newspapers we have and the large composite graduation pictures that have been donated to the Alumni Association.

For those who may not have known, Mr. Weber died on May 9, 2019. Mrs. Weber is living at an assisted living facility. She is 92. According to Bill, she is doing relatively well. For any who remember Mrs. Weber and would like to send her a card, her address is: Brookdale Pinnacle, 1305 Lamplighter Dr., Grove

> City, OH 43123. Whether you think she would remember you or not, we are certain she would like to hear from you.

The Alumni Association currently has over 300 yearbooks for sale. Those in the Weber donation are already spoken for. We are currently contacting those waiting for those years. We have a Yearbook Wait List of about 200 alumni. Some have been on our list for over 15 years! For several years we have multiple individuals waiting on the same yearbook! When we try to contact someone, occasionally the information given us is no longer current. We do look for other ways to contact them (Alumni Association membership information, Facebook, class representatives, and Internet searches). We never remove a name from our Wait List unless asked to. When we cannot contact someone, we keep him or her on the list and move to the next person listed.

Whenever a yearbook is donated, we first check our Wait List to see if anyone is waiting on it.
